



## Guam-PIC Policy 1.3: Code of Conduct Policy

Interns are expected to follow Guam-PIC's Code of Conduct.

Guam is a small island. While interns' lives outside of GBHWC will not be micromanaged by the Guam-PIC Training Committee, you will be seen by community members, which may include GBHWC consumers and their families, other GBHWC employees and GBHWC administration, GovGuam employees and GovGuam administration, etc. For these reasons, please be mindful of your behavior and conduct when not at GBHWC. Even when in the community, please remember you are a representative of GBHWC and your graduate program, and please act accordingly. It is expected that interns follow the Guam-PIC Code of Conduct at all times during the year. Failure to meet these requirements may result in the initiation of the Guam-PIC Due Process Procedures.

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### **Guam Psychology Internship Consortium Code of Conduct**

1. Compliance with the APA Ethical Principles and Code of Conduct (amended last on 1/1/2017).
2. Compliance with all Guam-PIC policies and expectations.
3. Honesty and integrity in all professional interactions.
4. Respectful and professional behavior toward all Guam-PIC faculty members, interns, agency staff, guests, and clients both within and outside of standard work hours.
5. Support of and contribution to the betterment of the Guam-PIC training program.
6. Active and meaningful participation as a member of the internship cohort.
7. Willingness to be supervised, including following supervisors' (appropriate) directives, and to accept constructive criticism.
8. Acceptance of responsibility for one's own actions.
9. Pursuit of problem resolution through appropriate channels.
10. Submit necessary documentation within specified timeframes.
11. Compliance with any codes of conduct or policies regarding professional expectations at Guam-PIC Member Agencies.
